Notes and Details of each meeting / event:

Summer Challenge - 15th September 2026 = “Summer in the City”

“Hot town, Summer in the City. Back of my neck getting’ dirt’ and gritty”

An opportunity to present your images interpreting the theme of Summer in the City.

It can be any City anywhere, but it must be during this summer 2026. It can be street photography, urban landscape, architecture, daytime or nighttime. It does not matter what the weather conditions are, hot, sunny, dry, wet or cloudy etc. It's about your take and thoughts on how you represent the challenge.

Members Evening - 29th September 2026 Subject = Portraying “perspective”

It's all about Perspective - the art of drawing solid objects on a two-dimensional surface so as to give the right impression of their height, width, depth, and position in relation to each other when viewed from a particular point. Perspective is when you look down a set of railway lines, only to see them converge to a point (but not railway lines heading into the distance). It's the way your brain understands depth in a scene. Or you can opt for something creative and instead depict your perspective on a topic or scene; this would be more story-based, as opposed to compositional. Present your images and tells us about your approach and thinking behind them.

Zoom Talk – 6th October 2026 Subject = Photography Projects and Photobooks by Stewart Wall

This talk offers an introduction to the core techniques essential for project photography and photobook creation. It looks at a selection of the projects and photobooks the speaker has completed over the last decade, and some of his favourite photobooks created by others. The talk covers - Creating Photography for Photobooks, Project and Photo-Essay Development looking at how to conceptualise, structure, and organise photographs into cohesive projects and photo-essays, essential skills for creating meaningful narratives in your photobooks, Integration of Text and Images by developing the confidence to pair

photographs with text, enriching your photo-essays and enhancing the storytelling potential of your work. It also looks at Collaborative Photobook Projects which could be an ideal activity for a club.

Members Evening - 20th October 2026 = IT Support Event & Photo Editing

Bring your IT issues and kit with you or any photo editing issues. This will be an opportunity to share any problems and hopefully get some answers from other members. George has offered to host this event.

PDI Challenge 1 - 27th October 2026 = Film Genres

Last seasons "The Movies" challenge was a great success so this seasons its films again but this time its film genres and not film titles. Capture and show some images that represent film genres e.g. Horror, Romance, Action, Sport etc.

Members Evening - 17th November 2026 = Kitchen & Household Items

A workshop to capture kitchen and household items from a different perspective and context. Bring in any of your kitchen and household items and use the Society's lighting as part of a workshop. Then edit and share the results at a future meeting.

Members Evening – 1st December 2026 = Out of Place

This challenge is all about creativity! Out of place can be subtle or surreal, funny or jarring. For example; a rubber duck in a toolbox, a dancer in a factory, a laptop in the woods. Something that doesn't belong, or feels like it has landed in the wrong context. It's all about contrast between subject and environment, emotion and setting, expectation and reality. Start getting creative and show us the best images.

Members Zoom Evening – 8th December 2026 = Kitchen & Household Items feedback

Present your images from the Kitchen and Household items workshop held on 17th November 2026.

Members Zoom Evening - 19th January 2027 Subject = Odd Numbers

It's all about using odds in our photography. Present images showing how you have used the rule of odds. For example, an odd number of objects (people, animals, things), etc. Think in threes, arrange your subjects in a way that guides the viewer's eye through the image and uses an odd number to create a sense of balance while maintaining visual interest.

Whether you choose three flowers, five people, or seven stones, make sure your composition leverages the power of odd numbers to draw the viewer's eye and create interest. Look for interactions with an odd number of people chatting in the coffee shop, children or dogs playing in the park, or maybe an odd number of musicians playing music. Street scenes are full of life and stories and oddities!

PDI Challenge 2 - 26th January 2027 = Shooting from the Hip

Shooting from the hip means holding your camera at waist level and taking photos without looking through the viewfinder or LCD screen.

This technique forces you to trust your instincts, rely on your sense of framing, and embrace the unpredictable. It's about spontaneity over precision, capturing life as it unfolds rather than carefully composing every element.

This technique works particularly well for street photography and candid moments where raising a camera to your eye might make your subject aware of you. Shooting from the hip helps you stay invisible, capturing people in their natural state. You'll likely need to take more shots to get one that works, but the authentic moments you capture are worth it.

Members Evening – 2nd February 2027 = Food Photography. Show us your best 5 to 8 images.

Have a go at your own food photography or attempt to recreate a food advert and present your results. This could be your favourite meal, a beloved snack, or even the ingredients that make up your dish. Whether it's plated perfection, a quick bite, or a messy masterpiece, show us the delicious details. It is also a good chance to showcase some of the unique aspects of your location, people, or culture through the food that

you eat! Food photography is about telling a story of flavours, textures, and colours. You might capture the vibrant colours of fresh produce, the steam curling from a cup of coffee, or the texture of a homemade meal. Complement the food with utensils, napkins, or cutting boards. Keep the background clean or use elements that enhance the story. Play with contrasting or complementary hues to make your subject pop.

Zoom Talk – 2nd March 2027 = Subject = Abstract and Minimalism photography by Daniel Bridge

Abstract and Minimalism photography talk looks at ways to refine and simplify compositions, creating abstract images from a variety of different subjects, making use of techniques such as Intentional Camera Movement (ICM), long exposures, making use of windows and doors to frame a view, and more. Daniel also discusses how he uses selective vision to home in on the relevant details to include and avoiding extraneous elements to highlight what caught his eye in the first place.

Members Evening - 9th March 2027 = Subject = “A quiet Moment”

Shoot and submit photos encapsulating a “quiet moment”. Where is your quiet place a morning coffee, sunset yoga, a specific landscape or places that mean something to you or maybe even a Heavy metal concert?

The challenge is to find your quiet place (s) or moment(s) and work out how to best to capture it or them and represent it in an image(s). Show your images and talk about your “quiet moment (s)” and why you chose it / them.

Members Zoom Evening - 16th March 2027 Subject = Negative Space

When you highlight negative space, your subject stands out, and your image can feel more calm or impactful. Think of wide, open skies, minimalist interiors, or uncluttered walls. Aim to simplify your scene so the viewer’s eye is drawn exactly where you want it. Less can definitely be more. Present your images and talk through your approach.
